This funding will be used to


- Ensure that 90% of students in all year levels achieve a 'C' or above in English assessment tasks that are linked to the Australian Curriculum.
- Ensure that 100% of students in year 3 and year 5 achieve national minimum Standards or higher in National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) testing.
- 90% of students in all year levels achieve the Forsyth State School reading targets by the end of the year.

Our initiatives include


- . Collaboratively identify the reading and writing demands of the Australian curriculum and develop a provision for Whole school curriculum.
- . Work with Georgetown, Mount Surprise and Croydon Schools, to amalgamate resources to support professional development pertaining to reading.
- . Build the capability of Teacher/Teacher-Aide, Principal and Operational support personnel to understand the Literacy continuum, its benefits and implementation processes.
- . Implement the LITERACY CONTINUUM to track student progress.
- . Provide immediate and effective intervention (Early Start pedagogies) for targeted students.
- . Monitor student attendance, engagement and behaviours.

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| • Providing targeted professional learning for staff and Teacher Relief Scheme (TRS) thereby developing teacher capability in the areas of phonics and grammar | \$3 000 |
| • Purchasing of targeted resources | \$1 600 |
| • Collaborative planning, modelling, observation and feedback processes/consistent school-wide pedagogical practice | \$1 106 (TRS) |
| • Building parent- community capacity through phonics and grammar workshops (no cost). | |
